This way, the court space can be used for multiple activities such as badminton, volleyball, wallybally, football (to name only a few) but also for group sports such as aerobics, zumba and other dance and fitness classes.

This way, the owner archives the maximum usage of the available space and draws more people, especially non-squash players into his center who then might turn into squash players.

MIRROR WALLS

Installing mirror glass back walls, enhances the opportunities for serious dance activities even more, allowing for the participants to analyse and review their correct movement.

ROTARY WALLS

Last but not least, another upgrade can be a rotary glass back wall. In this configuration, the entire glass back wall opens like a big door, opening up the entire court area for major social events and receptions.
